PGY2 EMERGENCY MEDICINE PHARMACY RESIDENCY: CERTIFICATE ACHIEVEMENT

PURPOSE:

To outline the requirements needed to obtain a Certificate of Achievement for completion of an Emergency Medicine PGY2 Residency.

POLICY:

RAC will meet each year to review candidate progress and completion of requirements and vote on the successful completion of the PGY2 Emergency Medicine Residency. Upon RAC approval of the successful completion of the residency requirements, a certificate of completion will be issued to the resident

The resident must meet the following requirements to receive a residency certificate:

- Comply with all institutional, departmental, and residency policies and be an employee in good standing at Aultman at the time of residency completion.
- Complete a minimum of 12 months (approximately 2000 hours) of full-time training.
- Satisfactory completion of all assigned learning experiences (monthly and longitudinal) and all required residency activities. Remedial work must be completed as determined by the preceptors and Residency Program Director (RPD) for unsatisfactory rotations.
- Achieve at least 80% of residency program learning goals and objectives and obtain satisfactory progress on any remaining objectives as documented on learning experience evaluations.
- Submit the tracked and preceptor signed list of completed required direct and required non-direct patient care core areas listed in the Appendix of the Emergency Medicine Postgraduate Year Two Pharmacy Residency Competency Area, Goals, and Objectives.
- Complete all assignments and projects as assigned by the preceptors within monthly and longitudinal learning experiences as assessed by preceptor evaluations.
- Complete all requirements of a residency project including presentation and final report.
- Complete all assigned evaluations and surveys within PharmAcademic[™].
- Attend at least one professional state or regional meeting and a national pharmacy meeting. If the residency preferred meeting is not attended, it is the resident's responsibility to seek out, gain Residency Advisory Committee (RAC) and RPD approval of and fund an alternative meeting.
- Complete a residency portfolio that includes all required deliverables (See Appendix A), projects, evaluations, and project documents and submit to the RPD for RAC approval during the last month of the residency.
- Participate in recruiting activities for the residency.
- Complete an exit interview.
